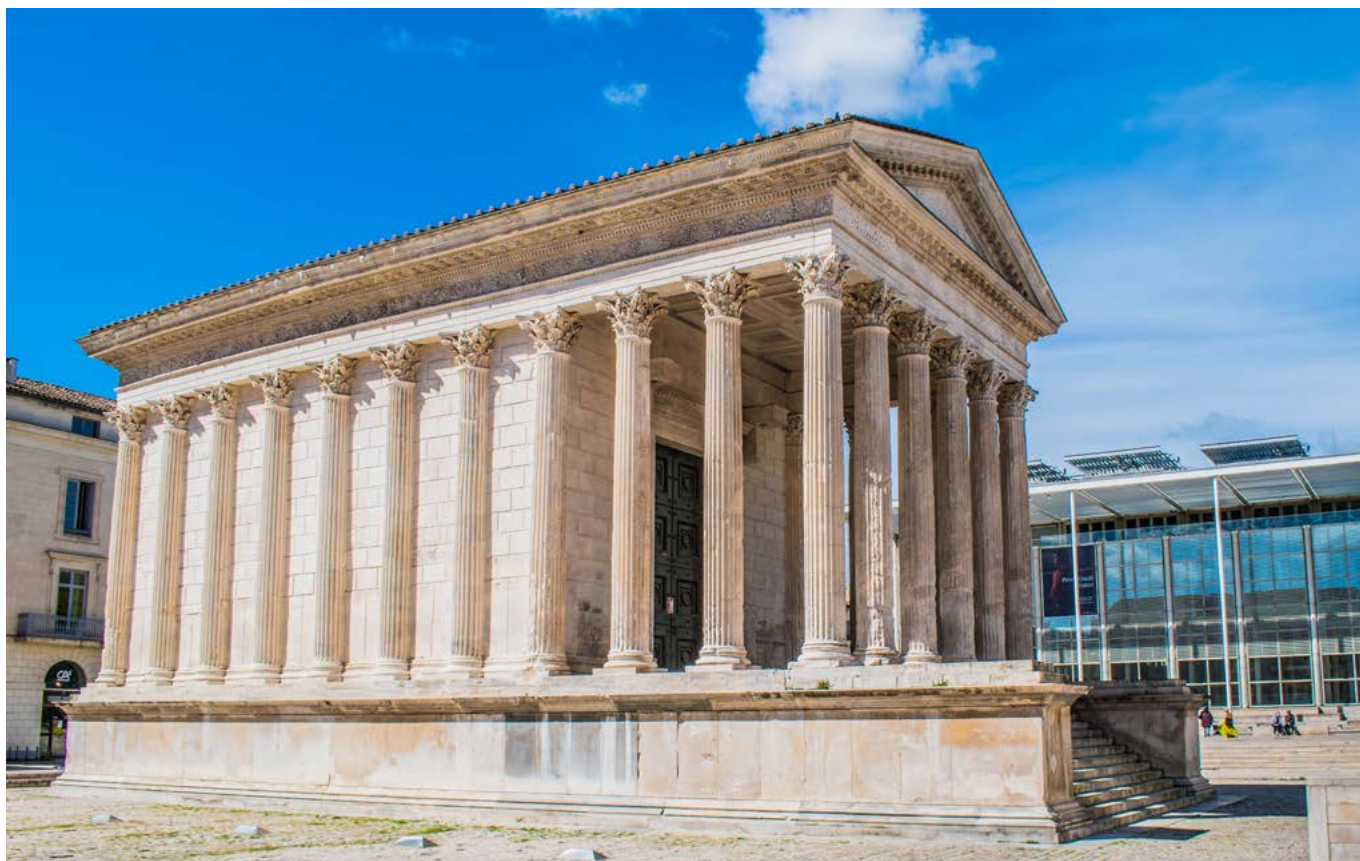

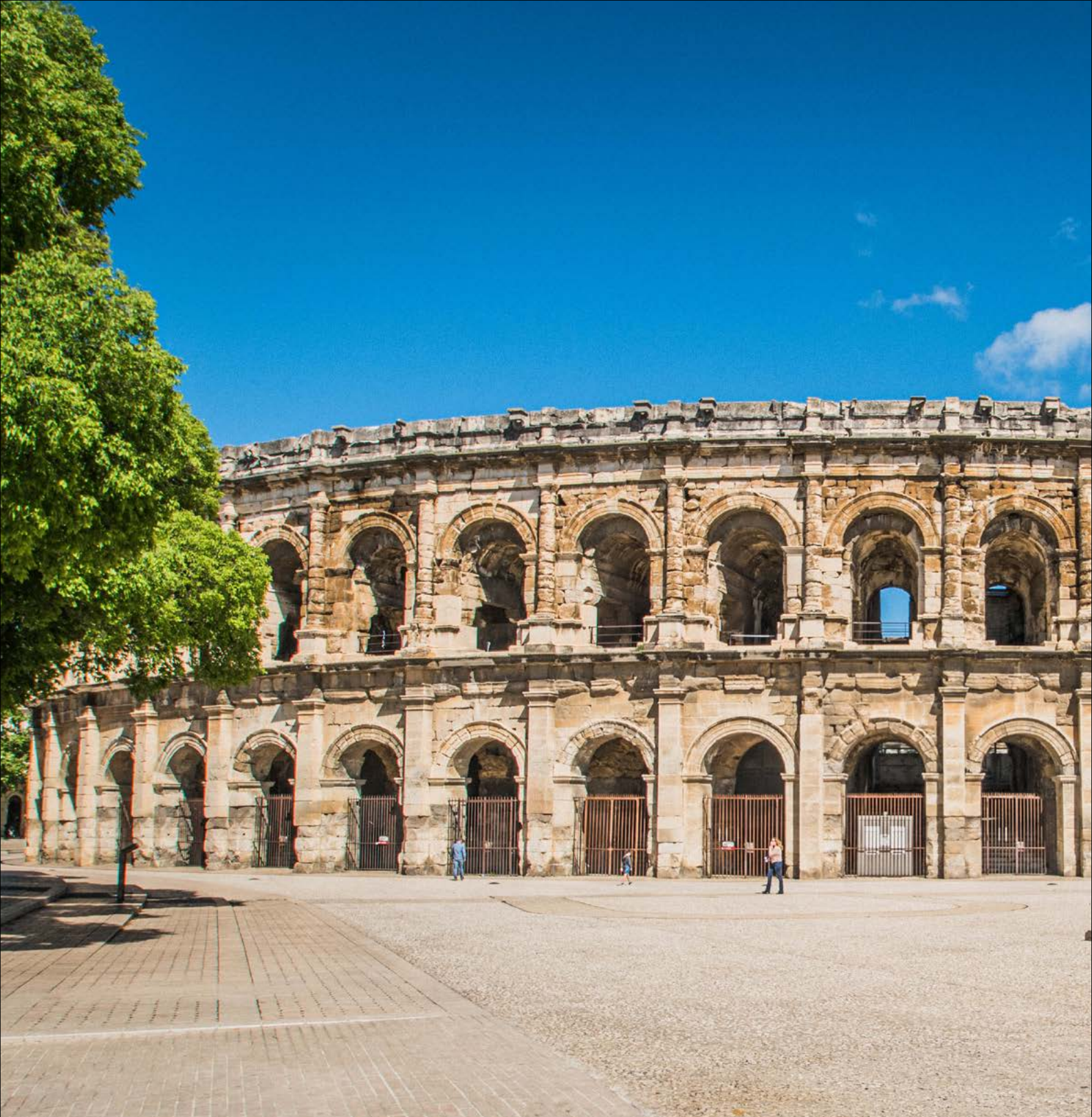

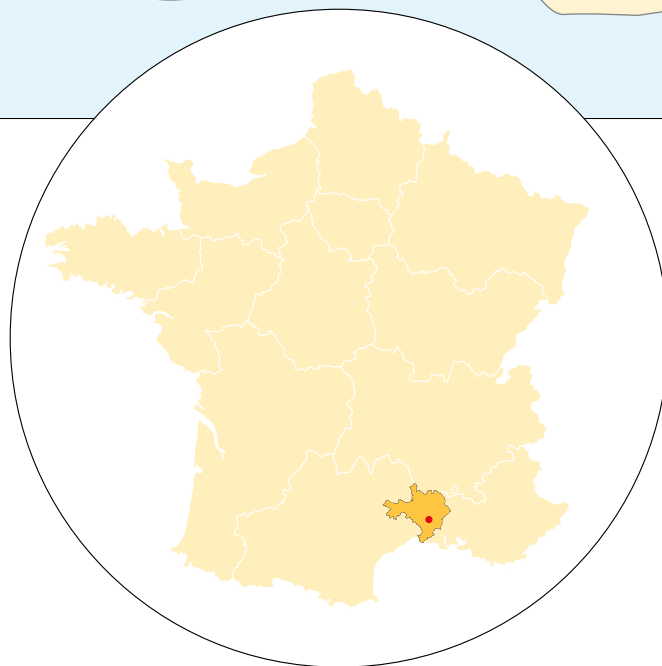

MAISON CARRÉE



MAISON
CARRÉE

PATRIMOINE
MONDIAL

Dedicated to Caius and Lucius Caesar, grandsons of Emperor Augustus, the Maison Carrée was built in the 1st century AD and is one of the best-preserved Roman temples in the world. It captivates visitors with the harmony of its proportions, the elegance of its Corinthian columns and the refinement of its architectural decoration.

The Maison Carrée has been listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 2023.



LES ARÈNES

The amphitheatre is considered one of the best preserved in the Roman world. Built at the end of the 1st century AD, shortly after the Colosseum in Rome, it could accommodate more than 24,000 spectators who attended hunts and animal and gladiator combats. Today, the amphitheatre hosts bullfighting events, congresses, concerts and sporting events.

JARDINS DE LA FONTAINE

The first inhabitants of Nîmes settled near the sacred spring as early as the 6th century BC. In the 1st century BC, the Romans integrated it into a vast sanctuary known as the Augusteum, dedicated to the god Nemausus and Emperor Augustus.

Rediscovered in the 18th century, the site was transformed into a magnificent French-style garden designed by architects Jacques-Philippe Mareschal and Pierre Dardailhon, respecting the layout of the ancient remains. The upper part of the garden was landscaped in the early 19th century, inspired by Italian and English styles.



TOUR MAGNE

The “Grande Tour” dominates the ancient sanctuary and formed part of the Augustan enclosure wall, which stretched over more than 6 kilometres. Rising to 36 metres, it incorporated an earlier Gallic tower, 18 metres high, which disappeared in the 17th century. Today, at a height of 32.5 metres, it offers remarkable panoramic views extending from Mont Ventoux to Pic Saint-Loup.



TEMPLE DE DIANE

Dating from the 1st century BC, this building formed part of the Augusteum complex alongside the sacred spring, a large portico, a small theatre and a nymphaeum. Although its exact function remains uncertain and the origin of its name unknown, its richly decorated interior is well preserved. The romantic character of its ruins has inspired many artists, including the painter Hubert Robert.

Anecdote

The coat of arms

In 31 BC, Octavian defeated the fleet of Mark Antony and Cleopatra at Actium, bringing peace to the Roman world. He then established the Empire and became Augustus.

A coin minted in Nîmes to celebrate the event featured a crocodile chained to a palm tree crowned with laurels, symbolising defeated Egypt. Rediscovered in the 16th century, this image inspired the city's coat of arms, officially authorised by King François Ier in 1535. Redesigned in 1986 by designer Philippe Starck, it is now omnipresent throughout the city, even appearing on bronze studs embedded in the old town pavements.



► Anecdote

The origin of denim fabric

In the 17th century, Nîmes was renowned for its textile manufacturing. Merchants mainly traded in cloth and silk. Over time, production diversified with the import of cotton and indigo — a plant that provided a beautiful yet economical blue dye.

The “serge de Nîmes”, a durable fabric woven diagonally using undyed threads and surface-dyed indigo yarns, was created. It stood out from other fabrics through its progressive fading and its distinctive shades of blue and

white. At the time, trading posts were established all over the world.

The characteristics of this “serge de Nîmes”, exported to the United States via the ports of Genoa and Manchester, closely resembled denim — the fabric used by Levi Strauss in the 19th century to produce his famous jeans, sturdy and affordable trousers designed for American gold miners. While jeans have since conquered the world and become a symbol of freedom, their origins may well lie in Nîmes.



CASTELLUM AQUAE

Alongside Pompeii, this is an extremely rare surviving example from the Roman world. The Castellum was the arrival point of the Nîmes aqueduct, whose main structure is the Pont du Gard. From this circular distribution basin, lead pipes carried water to baths, public fountains and various districts of the city.



PORTE AUGUSTE ET PORTE DE FRANCE

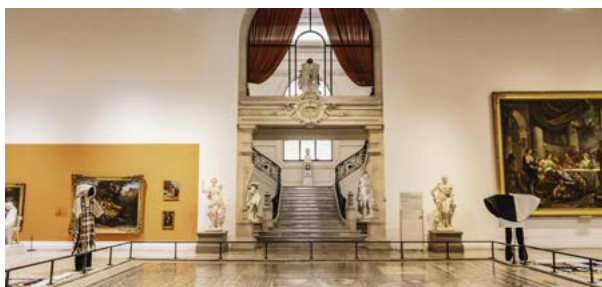
The Porte Auguste (also known as Porte d'Arles) was one of the main gates of the ancient city. Coming from Beaucaire, the Via Domitia crossed the city through this gate before continuing toward Spain. Dating from the 1st century BC, Porte Auguste and Porte de France are the only remaining gates of the Augustan enclosure still visible today.



CATHÉDRALE NOTRE-DAME-ET-SAINT-CASTOR

Consecrated in 1096, the Cathédrale Notre Dame-et-Saint-Castor has undergone numerous modifications over the centuries. The upper frieze is considered a major work of Romanesque sculpture in southern France. The motifs on the pediment and cornice — acanthus leaves and lion heads — were inspired by the Maison Carrée.

MUSÉE DES BEAUX-ARTS

CITY PASS Rue de la Cité Foulc

The Musée des Beaux-Arts, home to the second-largest collection in Languedoc-Roussillon, houses more than 3,600 French, Flemish, Dutch and Italian works. A Roman mosaic ("Les noces d'Admète"), discovered in the 19th century, decorates the ground-floor atrium.



MUSÉE DU VIEUX NÎMES

CITY PASS Place de Mère Teresa

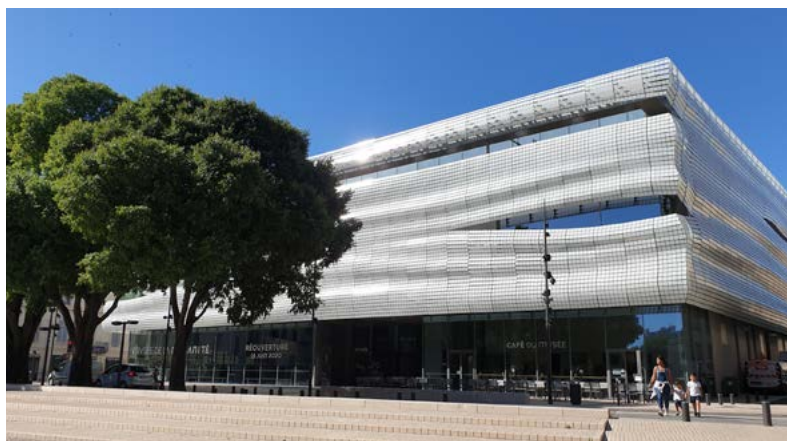
Located in the former episcopal palace dating from the late 17th century, the Musée du Vieux Nîmes presents life in Nîmes since the late Middle Ages. It showcases remarkable objects, products from the local textile industry and a dedicated section on the serge de Nîmes and jeans.



MUSEUM - MUSÉE D'HISTOIRE NATURELLE

CITY PASS 13 boulevard Amiral Courbet

The Museum houses collections related to natural sciences and human sciences, including prehistory, ethnography and zoology. The ethnography room maintains a presentation style that has remained almost unchanged since the 1930s.



MUSÉE DE LA ROMANITÉ

CITY PASS 16 boulevard des Arènes

Designed by Elizabeth de Portzamparc, this contemporary archaeological museum of international scope provides a magnificent setting for nearly 5,000 works ranging from Protohistory to the Middle Ages. Both an innovative museum, an archaeological garden and a living space, the building fulfils a triple ambition: preserving heritage, sharing it with visitors and transmitting it to future generations. Temporary exhibitions are also hosted every year.



MUSÉE D'ART CONTEMPORAIN CARRÉ D'ART JEAN BOUSQUET

CITY PASS 16 place de la Maison Carrée

Imagined by Norman Foster, the contemporary art museum houses nearly 600 works from the 1960s to today, highlighting a dynamic and diverse collection.



MUSÉE DES CULTURES TAURINES HENRIETTE ET CLAUDE VIALLAT

CITY PASS 6 rue Alexandre Ducros

The Musée des Cultures Taurines is unique in France and celebrates living bullfighting traditions. It displays artworks and objects illustrating regional and international cultures.

ABBATIALE DE SAINT-GILLES

CITY PASS ABBATIALE
DE SAINT-GILLES | PATRIMOINE
MONDIAL

Built at the end of the 12th century, the Abbatale de Saint-Gilles is a true architectural gem. It has been listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1998 as part of the serial property “Routes of Santiago de Compostela in France”. Its monumental crypt is exceptional in scale and houses the tomb of Saint Gilles.



VIGNOBLE DES COSTIÈRES

The Costières de Nîmes territory is a generous sun-drenched vineyard landscape where vines have shaped the scenery and local identity for centuries. The AOP Costières de Nîmes wines, recognised for their freshness and elegance, perfectly accompany the discovery of this terroir between the Mediterranean and the Cévennes. Groups can meet passionate winemakers and experience an immersion in a territory where wine rhymes with conviviality and authenticity.

PONT DU GARD, L'AQUEDUC DE NIMES

CITY PASS PONT
DU GARD | PATRIMOINE

Built in the 1st century AD, the Pont du Gard — listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1985 — is undoubtedly the most spectacular structure of the aqueduct. Measuring 275 metres in length and 48 metres in height, it is the highest Roman aqueduct bridge in the world.

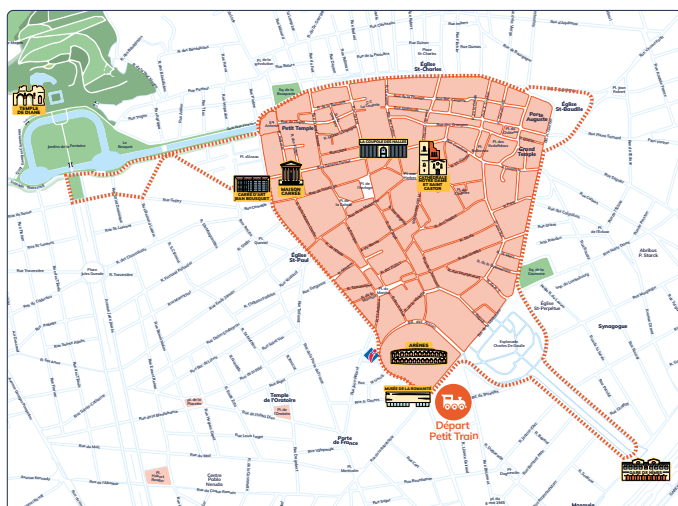

On the second arch of the lower level, an ancient engraving in the shape of a phallus can be seen. This symbol was often used as a good-luck charm or to ward off evil spirits. Legionnaires or construction workers may have engraved it to protect the structure.

Nîmes, Saint-Gilles Themed Visits

L'ABBATIALE DE SAINT-GILLES

Discover the Abbatale de Saint-Gilles, listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1998, and its fascinating history. A major Christian pilgrimage site during the Middle Ages, it has preserved its beautifully sculpted 12th-century façade, the upper church and reliquaries, as well as the monumental crypt housing the tomb of Saint Gilles. At the end of the guided visit, explore the Old Choir and its remarkable spiral staircase.



STREET ART

The Richelieu and Gambetta districts come alive with colour thanks to different editions of the festival "l'expo de Ouf". Discover monumental frescoes that transform building façades into an open-air museum.

Learn about the vocabulary and codes of street art: tags, graffiti, collages and stencils will no longer hold any secrets for you. Vandals, you say? What if street art were actually the artistic movement of the 21st century?

NÎMES AND THE CROCODILE

Did you know that a crocodile can live up to 100 years? Attached to its palm tree, its story has been linked to Nîmes since Antiquity. Today, it is present throughout the city in many different forms. Explore Nîmes in search of this iconic symbol and learn about its extraordinary physical and physiological abilities at the Museum d'Histoire Naturelle.





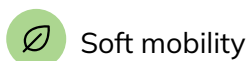

Bikes can be rented and returned at any station. With a range of 70 to 100 km and GPS tracking, they allow real-time geolocation.

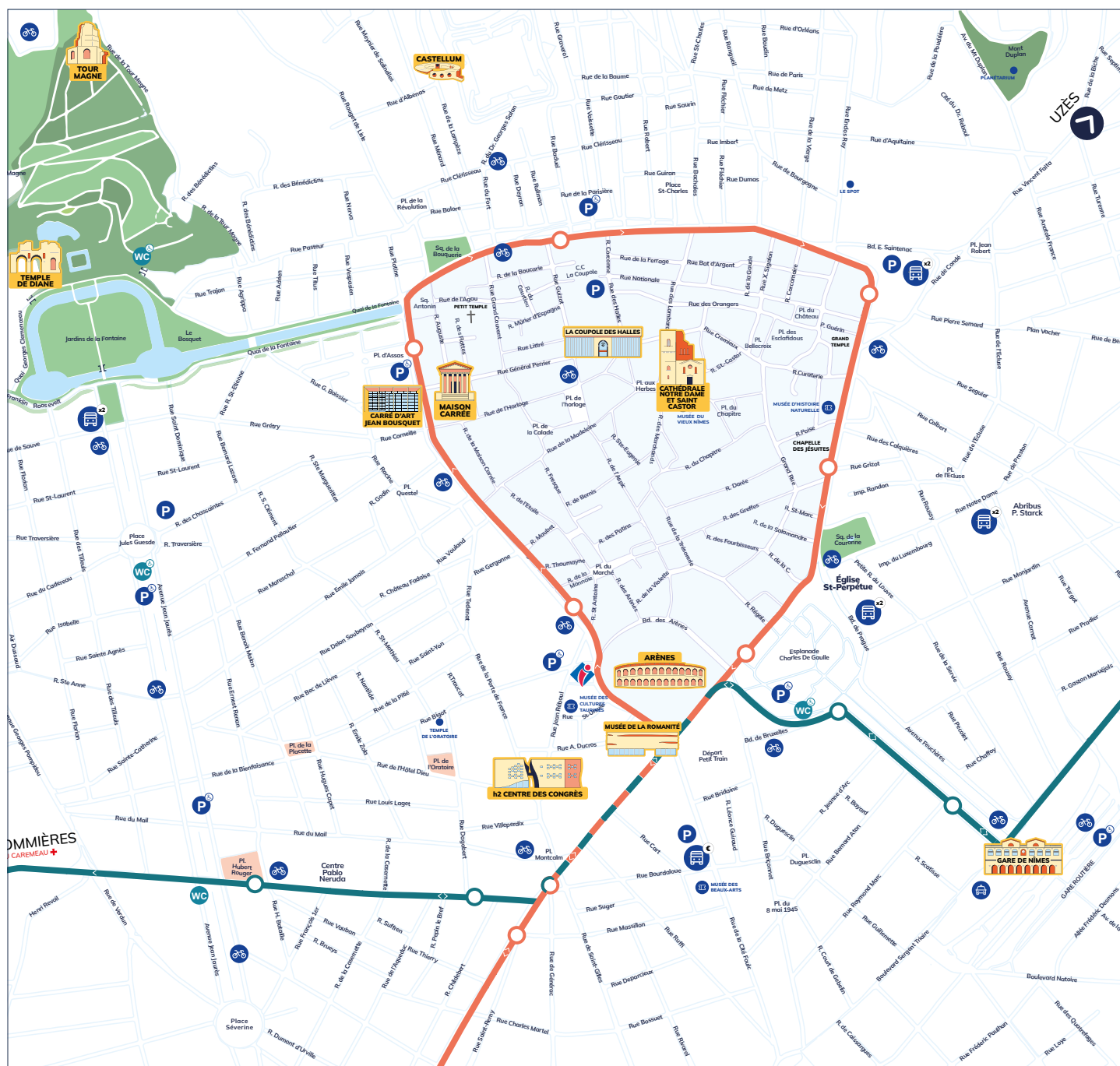

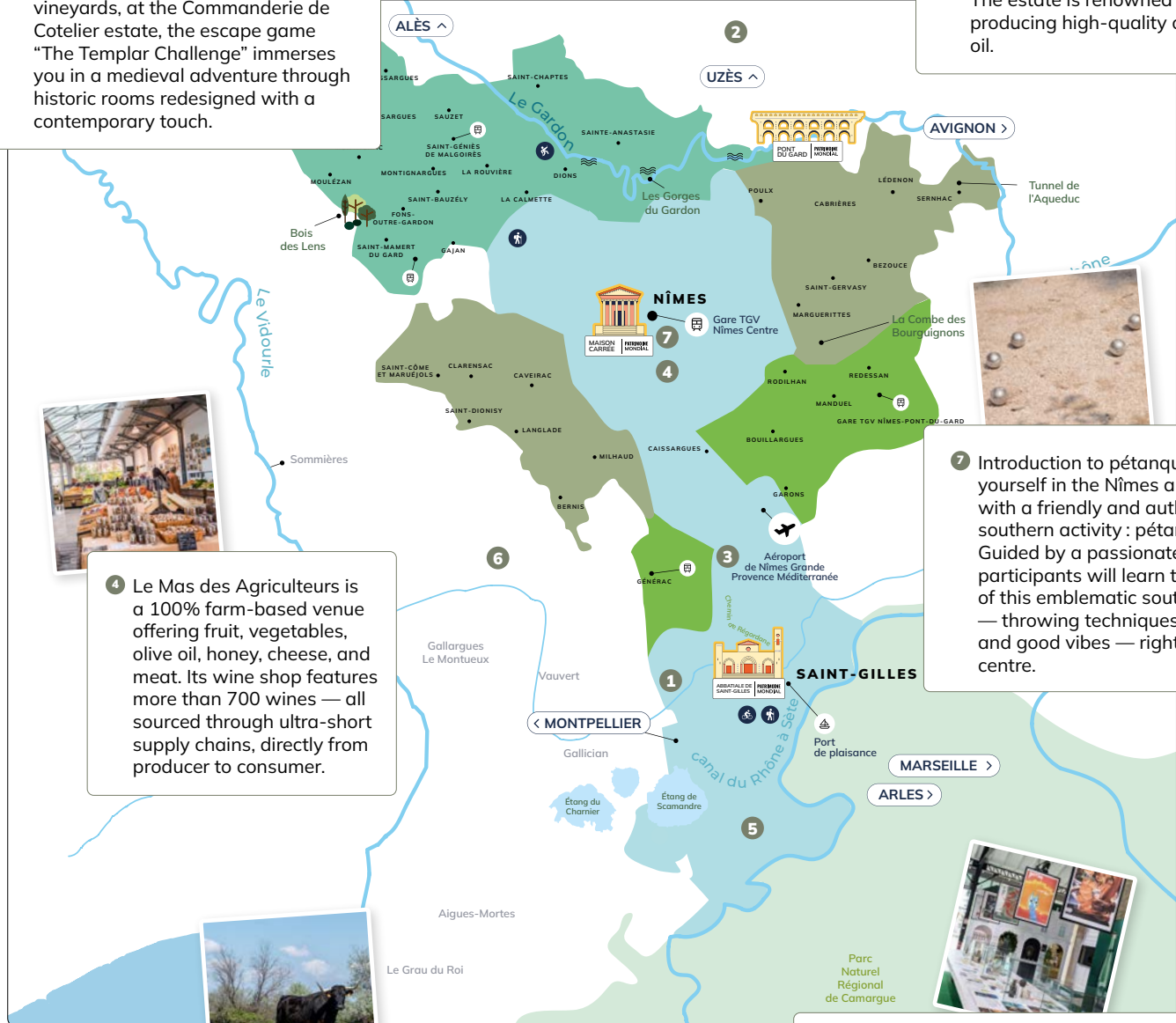
